**Prof. Andrey Korenevsky**

Professor at the Southern Federal University in Rostov-on-Don, Plenipotentiary Representative of Rector for cooperation with partners in the Republic of Poland, former Director of the Interdepartmental Individual Studies in the Humanities (MIGO) at the Southern Federal University, specializes in the history of political and religious thought of the Middle Ages and of the modern times, author of the monograph *The Idea of “Byzantine Heritage” in the religious and political thought of the 15<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> century*.

**Prof. Joanna Schiller-Walicka**

Professor at the Institute of History of the Polish Academy of Sciences, specializes in the history of science and education in the Kingdom of Poland and the Russian Empire of the 19th century, author of the book *Universitas rossica. The Concept of a Russian University of 1863-1915*, Warsaw 2008.

**Prof. Jan Kieniewicz**

Historian, full professor at the faculty of “Artes Liberales” of the University of Warsaw, Head of the “Artes Liberales” Laboratory for Interdisciplinary Research, author of the book *Introduction to the History of Western and Eastern Civilization*, Warsaw: DIALOG Academic Publishing House, 2003.

### **Dr. Paweł Brudek**

Researcher at the Tadeusz Manteuffel Institute of History of the Polish Academy of Sciences, author of the essay "Russia and the Russians" published in the Deutsche Warschauer Zeitung in the years 1915 - 1918 which had been prepared within the Section for Social Transformations of the 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> century at the Tadeusz Manteuffel Institute of History of the Polish Academy of Sciences. His main fields of interest are: World War I, colonialism and the 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> century history of Africa and Asia.

### **Dr. Jan Ciechanowski**

Assistant Professor at the Faculty of "Artes Liberales" of the University of Warsaw, he specializes in the history of World War II, the history and culture of the Mediterranean, the history of Spain (especially Spanish civil war of 1936-1939), as well as the problem of collaboration during World War II and the history of diplomacy.

### **Prof. Hieronim Grala**

Historian, diplomat, academic teacher at the Faculty of Artes Liberales of the University of Warsaw, Honorary Professor of the Moscow Academy of Economics and Law (MAEL), he is a member of the Polish-Russian Historical Commission and the founder and editor of the series: *Monumenta historica res gestas Europae Orientalis illustrantia. Fontes XV–XVII saec.* (Warsaw–Moscow). In 2000–2009 he was the head of the Polish Institute in Saint Petersburg and of the Polish Institute in Moscow.

### **Dr. Tatiana Filippova**

Historian, employed at the Institute of History of the Russian Academy of Sciences, scientific consultant of the "Дилетант" (*Dilettante*) historical journal. Her main scientific interests are the issues of "the other", "one of your own" and "the enemy" in the cultural reflection of the Russian society during the times of the late empire, the wars and modernization, as well as Russian satire in the context of the wars and the revolution.

### **Prof. Ludmila Kuzmicheva**

Historian, Associate Professor at the Division for the History of Southern and Western Slavs (Faculty of History of the Lomonosov Moscow State University), she focuses on the history of the Balkan nations, Russian-Serbian dynastic ties, the fate of the representatives of the Karageorgevich and Romanov dynasties. She is a member of the Russian-Serbian Historical Commission and of the Editorial Council of the «Мемориал ратја» journal (Belgrad, Serbia) and the «Српске студије» journal (Belgrad, Serbia).

### **Dr. Piotr M. Majewski**

Historian of the modern period, deputy director of the Museum of the World War II. Specializes in the Central European issues. The primary fields of research interests - the history of Czech and Czechoslovak Republic, as well as Czech-German relations in the nineteenth and twentieth centuries. Studies the issues of forced migrations in the twentieth century, foreign policy of the Polish People's Republic (PRL), World War II museums, and the history of the University of Warsaw.

### **Prof. Włodzimierz Mędrzecki**

The director of the Section for Social History of the 19<sup>th</sup> and the 20<sup>th</sup> century of the Manteuffel Institute of History of the Polish Academy of Sciences, his research focuses on the social and cultural transformations of the Polish society in the 2<sup>nd</sup> half of the 19<sup>th</sup> century and the 1<sup>st</sup> half of the 20<sup>th</sup> century as well as on the processes of nation formation on the territories of the former Nobles' Democracy.
