On July 12, 2013, the Faculty of “Artes Liberales,” University of Warsaw and Taurida National V.I. Vernadsky University (Sinferopol, Ukraine) co-organized a Teleconference – *Towards an Integrated Understanding of the User’s Identity in the Cyberspace of the Internet: A Multidisciplinary Dialogue* with participation of about scholars from Poland (Warsaw and Kraków), Ukraine, Germany (Leipzig) and the US.

The idea of such a conference came initially from the Open Seminars Cycle conducted by the Faculty of “Artes Liberales” and attended by Dr. Nadyia Zudilina from Sinferopol, who came to Poland for the first time in 2009, still before her PhD, within the program International School of Humanities (Międzynarodowa Szkoła Humanistyczna) and came back since several times. Dr. Zudilina has worked on the subject of identity in the Internet for several years now; it was also the theme of her PhD dissertation successfully defended in 2012.

With practically no financial resources, she managed to put together a team of researchers from a variety of disciplines (various philologies, psychology, philosophy, cultural studies) willing to participate in research and international debates, of which the July 12 Teleconference was the first stage; it was made possible by the Faculty of “Artes Liberales” of the University of Warsaw ensuring the venue, IT and academic support. As most of the members of the team spoke or understood Russian, the expense of translation services was avoided, however interested researchers from Belgium, Germany, and Czech Republic were unable to participate online. A second teleconference is being planned for next year and this time either the language of the conference will be changed to English, or funding will be sought for simultaneous translation.

A wide range of stimulating issues related to the identity in the cyberspace of the Internet was discussed during this first teleconference, including diversity of such identity, a Phenomenological view of identity in the Web 2.0, single or multiple identities, physical identity vs. virtual identity, anonymity & personalization in the cyberspace, axiological aspects of cyber identity, a matrix of values for an Internet identity, religious aspects of virtual identity in social and cultural communication, typology of interpersonal communication within social networks, an interlocutor in cyberspace according to the Philosophy of Meeting by Martin Buber, concept of self in social media, verbal aggression as a way of virtual identification, identities in computer games.

The July 12 conference was the first conference of its kind and scope organized at the Faculty of “Artes Liberales,” an invaluable, successful experience that shows what can be done with available technology, a lot of enthusiastic effort and a true spirit of dedicated scholarship.
